- Use tissue or handkerchief while coughing or sneezing
- Make sure to trim nails weekly to restrict growth of germs
- · Always wear washed, cleaned and ironed clothes
- · Avoid putting fingers and things like pencil, pen or eraser in nose and mouth
- Do not spill food while eating
- Should not throw bits of paper or garbage on the floor, instead use dustbins
- Arrange the things like books, toys, shoes and bags at proper place
- Carry a bag to keep garbage while moving outside




COMPETITIONS




CHARTING INDIA
