


Republic Day Celebration



Republic Day is celebrated on 26th January every year to mark the day on which our constitution came into effect in 1950. After this day our country truly became democratic and independent. The fundamental law of the country, the Constitution, was enacted out of the diligence and hard work of great men like Mahatma Gandhi and the numerous other freedom fighters who fought and sacrificed their lives for the independence of our country.

It was therefore declared a National holiday and has been recognized and celebrated as the Republic Day of India ever since. It might seem like a question that curious pre-schoolers might ask why the date was specifically chosen for Republic Day to be celebrated. It is to be noted that January 26 had a great significance in India's struggle for Swaraj or autonomy. The Congress Session at Lahore on December 29, 1929, had passed a resolution declaring Purna Swaraj or complete, absolute autonomy as India's goal. It was also decided that the 26th of January should be observed all over India as Purna Swaraj Day. The complete Independence Day was celebrated on January 26th, 1930 for the first time. It continued to be observed until 1947. On achieving Independence, August 15 began to be celebrated as our Independence Day.





Basant Panchmi

The arrival of the spring season always brings joy on faces. Basant Panchami is celebrated across the nation for the arrival of the spring season and the festival is dedicated to Goddess Saraswati. Basant Panchami is one of the major Hindu festivals. It marks the arrival of the spring or the Basant season. The primary school had briefly reopened on March 1st, 2021 but was shut after two weeks in the wake of Covid 2nd wave. About 55 percent attendance was recorded in primary and pre primary sections on the first day of the academic session 2021-22.

“The thrill of being back at school was clearly visible among children and they were greeted with balloons, toffees and toys”, said Ms. Arti Jha, Principal DPS Aligarh. The school recorded 75% attendance among pre schoolers and 51% in the primary section. Most of the parents come to pick and drop their wards by their own transport.

Education is a human right, a public good and a public responsibility and thus be secured to all.


